


 The Rights of Diocesan Priests in the Code of Canon Law




- Purpose: to understand the rights that support and protect diocesan priests
- Focus areas: jurisprudence, identity, key rights, structure, modern reforms





- Key Canonical Rights
- Right of Association (canon 278)
- Right to Adequate Support (canon 281)
- Right to Ongoing Formation (canon 279 and Ratio Fundamentalis Institutionis Sacerdotalis (2016) 82)
- Right to Participate in Governance (canons 496 501)
- Right to Canonical and Civil Protection by Bishop (canon 384)



- Priests may form association compatible with the clerical state
- Encourages fraternity and mutual support
- Bishop's approval, not necessary, but ensures unity and orthodoxy







- Right to Ongoing Formation (canon 279)
- Lifelong learning in sacred, spiritual, and pastoral studies
- Right to attend pastoral courses and theological seminars
- Supported and facilitated by the diocese



- Participation in governance via the presbyteral council (canon 495-501)
- Right to be heard in diocesan matters (canon 500)
- Right to stable office and just procedures (canon 1740)

- Omnium in mentem (2009)
 clarified priest/deacon distinction
- Ratio Fundamentalis
 Institutionis Sacerdotalis
 (2016) on priestly formation, initial and ongoing
- Pascite gregem Dei (2021) due process in penal law

- Rights protect priestly dignity and enable ministry

A Safe and Welcoming Church

Safeguarding Children Policy and Standards for the Catholic Church in Ireland, 2024



If the respondent is asked to step aside from ministry, he is given the details of the complaint and informed of the enquires undertaken.



Consideration is given to the content of any public announcement. He will be advised that temporary withdrawal of ministry at this stage is precautionary.



The financial supports made available to the respondent are at the discretion of the bishop.



"It is not contained in the NBSCCCI guidance that the financial supports made available to the respondent are at the discretion of the bishop...



National Office Clarity

I had included that in my email to you as my understanding is that a bishop will consider this on a case-by-case basis...



National Office Clarity

The bishop's duty to ensure that his priests are provided for is a canonical matter – Canon 281 S.1-2 & Canon 1350 S1...



National Office Clarity

You might consider seeking the opinion of a canon lawyer to better answer your query."



A Guidance when preliminary investigation find that there is no case to answer or that the allegation is Manifestly false of Frivolous (Return to Ministry)



It is important that all outstanding matters are addressed prior to any return to ministry.



Therefore, in preparation, the respondent should be provided with counselling and support to assist them to deal with any residual anger/distress.



This preparation for a return to ministry should include spiritual direction, reflection and discussions with the Church authority.



It is understandable that the respondent may be angry at the process, but this anger should be addressed appropriately so as not to interfere with future ministry.





For the 13th century mystic Rumi- the shepherd represents someone who is both patient and vigilant, showing unconditional love and care.



Rumi explains that the shepherd's heart is attuned to the needs and desires of the flock.

The shepherd's flute, symbolic of the divine call, represents the guidance that leads the sheep home.

ACP Information Card

- When contacted by your Bishop/Superior always insist on knowing what it relates to.
- Bring someone with you who is of strong character and aware of the process. (ACP can provide someone.)
- We advise you to say nothing at the meeting.

- Request the diocese to resource a canon lawyer and civil lawyer of your choosing.
- Sign nothing and and give no verbal undertaking at the meeting.
- Do not be persuaded to ignore or bypass these guidelines no matter how often they say it is in your own best interest.
- Ask the person who accompanies you to take notes of the proceedings and to sign them.
