Cardinal Álvaro Ramazzini

Often referred to as a "frontier bishop," he has dedicated his ministry to social justice in Guatemala, championing the rights of indigenous Mayan communities, migrants, and the poor, and played a key role advocating for peace during Guatemala's civil war.

Prof. Omer Bartov

An Israeli-American historian and the Dean's Professor of Holocaust and Genocide Studies at Brown University. Born in Israel and educated at Tel Aviv University and St. Antony's College, Oxford, Bartov is widely regarded as one of the world's leading authorities on genocide.

Fr. David Neuhaus SJ

An Israeli Jesuit priest born in South Africa to a Jewish family; a long-term member of the Holy Land Catholic Church's Justice and Peace Commission, and writes widely on Scripture, Jewish-Christian relations, and the situation in Israel/Palestine.
